 - a. Career Centers in all California Counties staffing/services
 - 1. Veterans on staff
 - 2. Appointments and walk-ins for most services
 - 3. Help defining individual goals and direction
 - 4. Lots of veteran friendly jobs in databases, most are not minimum wage
 - 5. Help translating military skill into resume that employer will understand
 - 6. Job fairs, mock interviews, informational help directly with Veterans Employer Panels
 - 7. Workforce Investment Act grants for certificate programs
 - 8. Some part time and temporary jobs, but goal is permanent
 - b. Role of the Veterans Employment Representative
 - Address 18-24 year old veterans are underrepresented in the workforce
 - 2. Knowledgeable and trusted by veterans seeking assistance (culturally relevant)
 - 3. Focus is on getting veterans into full time jobs that last more than one year
 - c. Specific services for justice involved veterans
 - 1. Resume assistance
 - 2. Help explaining criminal history in interviews and resumes
 - 3. What is in your "expunged" records
 - 4. Only dishonorable discharges are not eligible for assistance at EDD
